2017 Annual Assembly: Held on Sunday, September 24th, this year's Annual Assembly included a financial presentation from our Treasurer Joe Bergantz. St. Michael's is in good shape financially and meeting its operating expenses. We are going to need to boost our fundraising efforts and pledge campaign in the near future, as we continue to develop our new church property. Gregory presented an update of all the miraculous blessings St. Michael's has received in helping us acquire and develop the new church property over the past year! President Bob presented a plan for some of the next steps. This year's church council members took their oath of office. <u>Church Property Work Parties</u>: This month's work continued at the new Church Property. The trees have now been cleared in the areas designated for the driveway, parking lot, cemetery, church and fellowship hall. We will now be working on removing the stumps and leftover treetop limbs in preparation for the new gravel driveway and parking area that we hope to have completed in time for Bishop Longin's visit on October 29th.

<u>New Spiritual Study Group</u>: On Wednesdays, right after Vespers, our Spiritual Study Group will continue based on the book "*The Struggle for Virtue*" by Archbishop Averky (who was a close friend of St. John Maximovitch). Vision for St. Michael's

Fr. Michael Pomazansky (author of *Orthodox Dogmatic Theology*), once wrote an article called "*The Purpose of the Orthodox Parish*." He used a quote from the Epistle of St. Paul to the Ephesians, Chapter 4:11-13; "*And He gave some, apostles, and some, prophets; and some, evangelists; and some, pastors and teachers; For the perfecting of the saints, for the work of the ministry, for the edifying of the Body of Christ: Till we all come in the unity of the faith, and of the knowledge of the Son of God, unto a perfect man, unto the measure of the stature of the fullness of Christ.*" Here then, is [the purpose of the Orthodox Parish]: the perfecting of the saints, the work of ministry, the building up of the Body of Christ…

Fr. Michael explained that "the perfecting of the saints," is the moral perfecting of the members of the Church. The salvation of souls in Christ is <u>first</u> and foremost; it must not be relegated to second place....Salvation in Christ is attained through prayer, through Divine services, the regulations of the Church, deeds of love and beneficence, and spiritual struggle...

The <u>second</u> task is the work of ministry—to God and to men...Participation in the [Church] services—in church reading and singing, <u>in constructing churches</u>, in caring for the beauty and cleanliness of the church—these are some examples of works, "for God." Ministry to men includes all manner of charitable activity for the needy, help for the sick and [other] efforts on behalf of others...A special and very important task is the religious upbringing of children and youth. This cannot be underestimated, for we are in danger of seeing the younger generations fall away from the Church...

The <u>third</u> task, the building up of the body of Christ, is ministry for the Church as a whole...We should never lose sight of the image of the whole Orthodox Church... Ministry to the Church as a whole means caring for church centers...At the local level, we are indebted to these Church centers. The Church Administration makes sure that the services are conducted properly...it safeguards the succession of episcopal and priestly ordination; it looks after the training and preparation of clergy, and provides pastors for church communities...It guards the Church against arbitrariness and against those people who introduce scandal into the Church. It safeguards the external dignity of Orthodoxy as well. It cuts off overt moral temptations, wards off attacks on faith and the Church, wherever they may come from. It is responsible for both the ideological defense of the Church and for her [legal] defense, when this called for...The task of building up the body of Christ's Church is great and many-sided. On the parish level it means that the parish community not shut itself up in its own narrow sphere, but that it be a beneficial and necessary, conscious part of the whole church body.

To summarize.

- <u>First:</u> we are called to work out our salvation—to practice prayer, fasting and almsgiving (and doing good deeds)—to attend the Divine Services as often as possible, to give confession and receive Holy Communion; to study the Sacred Scriptures and the writings of the Holy Fathers and Lives of Saints.
- <u>Secondly:</u> we must do all we can to support our parish church with our time, talent and treasure; to practice works of charity for the poor, the sick, the elderly...and especially help support the Christian education of our children—for they are the future of the church!
- Thirdly: St. Michael's does not exist in a vacuum: we are part of the greater body of the Serbian Orthodox Church, and of the Orthodox Church worldwide. We must do all we can to support our Bishop and the Diocese, for without the bishop, there is no church as St. Irenaeus said in the 2nd century. Finally, we as American Orthodox Christians have a special responsibility: to be 'missionary-minded.' As many converts have expressed, one of the main things that attracted them to the Orthodox Faith, is that they witnessed Orthodox Christians sincerely practicing their faith and felt the living Grace of the Holy Spirit! The beauty of the Divine Services, the icons, vestments, incense, bells and all the rest helped as well, but as Orthodox Christians, we are all called to become witnesses of our faith. "Acquire the Spirit of Peace and thousands around you will be saved" as St. Seraphim of Sarov used to say.
