The Nativity Fast

Having just begun the Nativity Fast, now is a good time to reflect on our preparation for the coming Feast of the Nativity of our Lord. It can be a little distracting at this time of year, since we are surrounded by all the usual secular holiday activities. It is always ironic that while the Orthodox Church, since ancient times, has directed us to fast in preparation for Christ's Nativity, our secular culture today begins celebrating the "Christmas Season" (as early as September) with the



holiday shopping, beautiful decorations, rich food and drink, and the usual holiday performances of the Nutcracker ballet, concerts and so on. While there's nothing wrong with these things in and of themselves, it's about the timing. If you were going to celebrate someone's birthday, would you start having cake and presents months in advance? If anything, you would wait until the person's actual birthday.

It was quite common until recent times, that the Christmas tree would put up and decorated on Christmas Eve. Then everyone would go to church to celebrate Christmas and when they came home, reveal the beautifully decorated tree. Presents would be exchanged that evening or the following morning and now the 'Twelve Days of Christmas' would begin to be celebrated.

As Orthodox Christians, our Holy Church gives us the proper way to prepare spiritually and celebrate the Nativity of the Lord. By establishing the forty-day Nativity Fast, we begin the work of spiritual (and bodily) purification. As St. Paul said, "What? know ye not that your body is the temple of the Holy Ghost which is in you, which ye have of God, and ye are not your own?" (I Cor. 6:19) Too often, we tend to identify with our body, as if this is who we really are.

Many of us have seen a cicada shell attached to a tree branch or side of our house. It looks like a real insect at first, but when we look more closely, we can see that it just the empty shell. In reality, the juvenile cicada must 'molt' and come out of this hard shell as it transitions to full adulthood. This is one of the many ways that the "Book of Nature" teaches us about life, death and rebirth and provides us with this powerful image. One day, we too will leave the empty shell of our body behind as our souls depart into the other world: our real home. As St. Herman of Alaska once said "The true Christian is a warrior fighting his way through the regiments of an unseen enemy to his heavenly homeland."

At one time or another, we've all invited a guest to come to our home for dinner. In preparation, we cleaned the house, straightened things up, put things away, set the table and so on. In the coming Feast of the Nativity, we will invite Christ to come into our hearts. The Nativity Fast is our way of spiritually cleaning our heart, mind, soul and body. In the book *Meditations for Advent*, Fr. Vassilios says, "Bethlehem becomes a synonym for "the Church." Christ is to be born within us: in our mystical celebration we shall become Bethlehem, the humble place of His Nativity, and so we must prepare ourselves in order that our Lord may make His dwelling within us."

May God's blessings be with you in this Holy Nativity Season!


