FEASTS

This past month, we began the Church Year (Liturgical Year) with the celebrations of **The Nativity of the Theotokos** on September 8 (21) and **The Exaltation of the Cross** on September 14 (27). We also continued the Moleben/Akathist services on Wednesday evenings to ask for heavenly intercession and support in the building of our new church.

The meeting of the Sisterhood took place Sunday, September 10th following Coffee Hour at the church.

On Sunday, September 3 following Liturgy, Nadine Tedford and Mary Zarzaur demonstrated how to turn a body with the use of flat bed sheets on top of a table. This is a technique that is used in hospitals with patients without harming the backs of the caregiver.

NEW PROPERTY UPDATE

We are now almost at the finish line! Our new General Contractor has initiated the process of obtaining a building permit. Our Bank is finishing up the all the loan documents. Once we have closed on the loan and signed off on the construction contract, we will officially be underway, probably within the next week or two. In the meantime, the water utilities are nearly completed and our Civil Engineer has been working with Huntsville Utilities to set up the electrical utilities. Please keep praying for this new church building that everything will continue to move forward without any obstacle!

Please RSVP by email, which workshop time works best for you. St. Michael's parishioners are welcome to attend and learn how the Holy bread is made, but in order *to offer it to the priest for Liturgy, the person must be a baptized, Orthodox Christian & current in their confessions*. Thank you for being willing to serve the Church in this way.

BAPTISMS: On Sunday, October 8, the Portillo family will be baptized and on Sunday, October 22, the Rivera family will be baptized.

SACRAMENT OF MATRIMONY: Since many of our parishioners are converts to the Orthodox Faith, some couples were married before becoming Orthodox. We are now in the process of scheduling those married couples to receive the marriage sacrament. On Sunday, October 15 following the Divine Liturgy, several couples including the Zarzaur, Litters, Harwells and Terrys will receive the marriage sacrament. This will include the traditional 'crowning' but will not be a typical wedding with all the usual bridesmaids and reception, etc. Please contact Fr. Gregory if you were married in a heterodox church or civil ceremony so that we can schedule the marriage sacrament.

THE HIEROMARTYR CYPRIAN AND JUSTINA THE VIRGIN (OCT. 2/15)


Cyprian moved from Carthage to Antioch, where Justina lived with her parents, Edesius and Cleodonia. Edesius was a idolatrous pagan priest, and his entire household was pagan. But when Justina, going round the Christian churches, came to know the true Faith, she brought both her father and mother to Christ the Lord and all three were baptised by the bishop, Optatus the bishop.

Cyprian, however was a sorcerer, and had links with unclean spirits and powers of divination. A certain dissolute pagan youth Aglaidas, tried to lead Justina astray, being enraptured by her beauty, and when the holy maiden firmly rejected him, sought Cyprian's help.

Cyprian invoked evil spirits, one after the other, on Justina, to set alight in her the passion of impurity towards Aglaidas, but they were totally unsuccessful in this, for St. Justina, with the sign of the Cross and prayer to God, drove out the evil spirits.

Then Cyprian came to know the power of the Cross and was himself baptized, in time becoming priest and then bishop. The wicked pagans seized both him and Justina, and they were sent for trial in Damascus; and then tortured, and beheaded in Nicomedia at the end of the third century.

Where: Rotate homes of willing hosts. You are not required to host if you are not able, so please just communicate as a group! Feel free to bring treats to share or meet somewhere neutral if no one is able to host on a given week. Barnes & Noble, Panera Bread, a library, or even the church (with father's blessing) may be available to meet up.

Who: It would be helpful if each group had a **group leader**. Simply someone to communicate the when and where each time you meet so I am not trying to keep tabs on both groups. If you are willing to do this for the group you will attend, please let me know as soon as possible so I can let everyone know who to look to for scheduling.

What: Read a chapter before each meeting, giving yourself time to answer questions, think it over, pray about the topics at hand. Also, don't feel pressure to answer the questions about your friends or hand off your book like it suggests if this doesn't fit for your group. Many of us are new friends so this is to help us come together as sisters in Christ, to learn together, and to get to know one another. Stay flexible and willing to decide things as a group and don't hesitate to reach out if you have questions.




