## PARISH NEWS

### FEASTS

This past month, we completed the Church Year (Liturgical Year) with the celebrations of the **Feast of the Transfiguration** on August 6/19 and the **Feast of the Dormition of the Theotokos** on August 15/28. We also continued the Moleben/Akathist services on Wednesday evenings to ask for heavenly intercession and support in the building of our new church.

**FEAST OF THE TRANSFIGURATION** There was a Vespers service at 6:00 p.m. on Friday, August 18th and on Saturday, August 19th, Matins at 8:45am and Divine Liturgy at 10:00 a.m. was celebrated.

On Sunday, September 3 after Liturgy, Nadine Tedford agreed to demonstrate how to turn a body with the use of flat bed sheets on top of a table. This is a technique that is used in hospitals with patients without harming the backs of the caregiver. We will meet in the sanctuary.

We will need a volunteer to be the person being turned over. Nadine suggested having an older child assist us since we will do it on one of the long folding tables and weight is a factor. Please contact Matushka Ann if you have someone who can help us. As a nurse, Nadine will answer any medical questions on attending the preparations of a person who has recently passed away. She has experience with death and dying.

We hope you will be able to come since Nadine is driving an hour and half from Tuscomb to be with us. Please let Matushka Ann know if you can attend and if you have any questions.

## Our Homeland is in Heaven

This September, we begin a whole new spiritual cycle: the Church New Year which begins on September 1/14. As St. Herman of Alaska once said, *“The true Christian is a warrior fighting his way through the regiments of the unseen enemy to his heavenly homeland.”* According to the word of the Apostle, our homeland is in heaven. About the warrior he says: *“We wrestle not against flesh and blood, but against principalities, against powers, against the rulers of the darkness of this world, against spiritual wickedness in high places (Eph.6: 12).”*

While we know that we will leave this earthly life one day, it's easy to forget how temporary it really is. After all, the kingdom of heaven is mostly invisible to our physical senses. However, the Holy Church is literally an image of the heavenly church and the heavenly kingdom. Through the Holy Sacraments, Prayer, Fasting, Almsgiving, and all the rest, we can catch a glimpse of the kingdom of heaven. Many of us have had the opportunity to venerate the relics of an incorrupt saint or experience a miracle working or myrrh-streaming icon. We have heard of other miraculous things like the miracle of the Holy Fire that takes place each year at Pascha in the Church of the Holy Sepulchre in Jerusalem.



As Orthodox Christians here in America, we live in difficult times. During the first three centuries, Christians were persecuted and martyred in great numbers, so in many respects, the issues we see today: apostasy, unbelief, immorality and so forth are nothing new. The challenge then is one of “Spiritual Survival” as Blessed Seraphim Rose called it. To survive spiritually, Fr. Seraphim said that we need to develop an Orthodox Worldview. His Spiritual Survival Course provided an outline that traced the downward spiritual direction of western culture from the time of the Great Schism, when the church of Rome broke away from the Orthodox Church. How then can we Orthodox Christians practice our faith and continue to grow spiritually in such an adverse environment today? The answer to this question is the One, Holy, Ecumenic (catholic) and Apostolic Church. No matter how crazy things get in the world around us, when we come to the church services and practice our faith with God’s help, we find the spiritual strength and support that we need to survive. St. Nikolai Velimirovic offers the following “Commandments of the Church” in which every Christian ought:

1. To go to church for public worship every Sunday, and on great holy days, besides the every-day prayers
2. To keep the fast periods and fast days as prescribed
3. To respect the priests as spiritual fathers
4. To confess sins with repentance before a priest
5. To avoid association with unbelievers and to read no atheistic, vulgar books
6. To pray for the living and the dead
7. To keep special fasts and prayers when they are ordered by the Church authorities in times of emergency such as war, pestilence, hunger, drought, etc.
8. To support the maintenance of the church, Church servants and Church institutions
9. To educate children by the Faith of our Fathers, and to admonish sinners to return to the Faith
10. To help in every respect the Orthodox Church’s mission in this world.

Let these be our “New Year’s Resolutions” for this coming Church New Year. By practicing these “Commandments of the Church” we will draw down the Grace of the Holy Spirit into our lives!








