The News at St. Michael's – July 2020

6th Annual Retreat on June 11-13: The Retreat this year was a tremendous blessing and consolation! We served daily Vespers and Matins, culminating with the Divine Liturgy and picnic on Saturday, June 13. Our Guest Speaker, Fr. Serafim Baltic gave several spiritual talks about Lay Ascetic Spiritual Life and Orthodox Missionary Witness. We, also, watched the new film "New Men" about the Holy Cross Monastery in West Virginia and Fr. Gregory presented a talk about Spiritual Fundamentals. This year, we had 60 adults and children attending and of those, 38 camped in tents, RV's and/or cabins. Thanks to Bob Zarzaur, Iryna Haddock and Kathy and Marc Couch for coordinating meals and Serena Harwell, Pavel Sievers, Stephanie Litter and Anthony Freude for helping with the children's program!

<u>Feasts & Fasts</u>: We celebrated the <u>Feast of Pentecost</u> on Sunday, June 7th including the "Kneeling Prayers" after Divine Liturgy. After a fast-free week, we began the Apostles Fast on Monday, June 15th which will end with the <u>Feast of the Apostles Peter and Paul</u> on July 12th.

Repose of Carl Brennan: As you probably heard, *Becky Brennan's* husband, *Carl*, reposed on June 3rd. He had been ill for some time with mesothelioma, (a form of cancer caused by prolonged exposure to asbestos). On Monday, June 1st, *Carl* asked to be received into the Orthodox Faith through chrismation. It was truly miraculous that despite his great struggles with his illness, he was able to be conscious and alert so that we could administer the sacraments of chrismation, confession and Holy Communion. The funeral was held on Friday, June 5th at St. Michael's Church and he was laid to rest the following week in Virginia where an Orthodox priest conducted the burial service. May his memory be eternal!

Christ is in our midst! Following are a few thoughts about the ongoing coronavirus situation. Despite all the fear and turmoil around us, the Scriptures and Holy Tradition have stood the test of time in their advice to us.

And fear not them which kill the body, but are not able to kill the soul: but rather fear him which is able to destroy both soul and body in hell. (Matthew 10:28)

"For God hath not given us the spirit of fear; but of power, and of love, and of a sound mind."
(2 Timothy 1:7)

"He who has become the servant of the Lord will fear his Master alone, but he who does not yet fear Him is often afraid of his own shadow." (Ladder of Divine Ascent, Step 21)

Archimandrite Gregorios Estephan, Abbot of Holy Dormition of the Theotokos Monastery, in Bkeftine, Lebanon recently wrote an article entitled "The Suicidal Church: In Body or in Spirit." He addresses the coronavirus situation from a spiritual perspective that is rooted in the Holy Scriptures, Sacred Tradition and the Holy Fathers. While this might seem to be a rather shocking title for an article, Arch. Gregorios is really talking about how it is like spiritual suicide for our Holy Orthodox Church to close during this time. He references ancient times when there have been other plagues (far worse than coronavirus) during which the Church did not close, but rather the faithful went to church in order to receive the Holy and Life Giving Body and Blood of our Lord, God and Saviour Jesus Christ! They went to Church to confess their sins so they could be healed and protected from all evil and also to pray for their loved ones and the world around us; asking God to protect them.

Just to put this into perspective: the "Black Plague" had a mortality rate of about 60% of those who were infected and it killed between 75 million to 200 million people worldwide. Let's not forget that the world population in the year 1350 was only 370 million, whereas today it is nearly 8 billion. According to a recent CDC estimate, the coronavirus in the US has a mortality rate of about .26%. We must ask ourselves the question, if the Orthodox Church continued to serve the Divine Liturgy even in times of the Plague, how much more should we be committed to celebrating the Divine Liturgy when the risk is so much less? Don't get me wrong, for someone who is in a high-risk situation (such as a serious medical condition), it makes sense to take reasonable precautions. However, we are seeing even Orthodox hierarchs and clergy closing church services today with the idea of 'protecting people's health!' While I'm sure they mean well, the very purpose of the Holy Church and our life here on earth is to prepare ourselves spiritually for eternity. This means that our spiritual life is literally the most important thing we can focus on! For example, when someone is near the time of death, do we not hope that the dying person is able to confess their sins and receive Holy Communion rather than focus on trivial and worldly cares?

I encourage all Orthodox Christians to make their 'spiritual health' their Number One concern. No one knows when their last day on this earth will be, so we should spend as much time as possible preparing for the next life where we will be for all eternity! May our Lord bless you all and grant you the "peace that passes understanding!"




