THE NEWS AT ST. MICHAEL'S

<u>Feasts</u>: This past month, we celebrated one of the Twelve Great Feasts—<u>The Meeting of the Lord</u>. On Friday, Feb. 14th there was a Vespers service and then on Saturday, Feb. 15th we celebrated Matins and Divine Liturgy. Also, during the month of February, we began the preparations for Great Lent. The Sunday of the Publican and the Pharisee on Feb. 9th was the official beginning of the "Lenten Triodion." This book contains all of the special liturgical prayers for the entire Lenten Season and takes us right up to the Midnight Paschal Service.

<u>Work Party at the New Property</u>: On Saturday, February 8th, eleven of the stouthearted men of St. Michael's worked on repairing the silt fence and cleaning up the multitude of tree limbs left by the recent tree clearing. Miraculously, it had been raining all week and stopped just in time for the work party on Saturday morning!

<u>House Blessings</u>: Following the Feast of Theophany in January when we blessed the Holy Water at the church, many of our parishioners have taken advantage of having their homes blessed. Not only does this bring the Grace of the Holy Spirit into our homes for the coming year, but it's a great opportunity to visit, since there often is not much time at the Sunday church service for that.

Coming up!

<u>Great Lent Begins</u>: Monday, March 2nd marks the beginning of Great Lent. During this first week, we have church services virtually every evening at 6pm (with the exception of Friday evening). The Great Canon of St. Andrew of Crete will be celebrated on Monday, Tuesday and Thursday evenings. On Wednesday evening, we will have our first *Liturgy of the Pre-Sanctified Gifts*. After the first week, our Lenten schedule will include the Liturgy of the Pre-Sanctified Gifts each Wednesday night (except for Wednesday, April 1st when Fr. Gregory will be out of town). If you wish to receive Holy Communion on Wednesday evenings, please fast after lunchtime on those days.

<u>Spiritual Study Group</u>: Following Pre-Sanctified Liturgy on Wed. evenings, we will have a Lenten meal followed by a spiritual study group. We will focus on the struggle against the passions and the acquisition of the virtues, using the text from St. John Cassian's 'On the Eight Vices' from the Philokalia.



Great Lent: The Time of Spiritual Struggle & Renewal

During the time of St. Mary of Egypt, (522 A.D.), monks would ask one another's forgiveness and then go out into the desert for the forty day fast. Each monk would go alone and take with him whatever he needed. They were to work on their own spiritual life, not worrying about what others were doing. The Holy Church gives us general guidelines to follow: keep the fast to the best of our ability, participate in prayer both at church and at home, do good deeds as much as possible, support our church and the poor, engage in spiritual reading each day and to come to confession and Holy Communion as often as possible. It is very important that we devote our time during Great Lent to work on ourselves and not judge our brother as we often hear in the Prayer of St. Ephraim so that's said throughout Great Lent.

Prayer of St. Ephraim the Syrian

O Lord and Master of my life, a spirit of idleness, despondency, ambition, and idle talking give me not.

But rather a spirit of chastity, humblemindedness, patience, and love bestow upon me Thy servant.

Yea, O Lord King, grant me to see my failings and not condemn my brother; for blessed art Thou unto the ages of ages.
Amen.

Great Lent is a time of spiritual struggle against the sinful passions that often tempt us and distract us. Some of us may have read the ancient Greek story of *The Odyssey* by Homer and/or saw the 1955 movie "Ulysses" with Kirk Douglas. As the crew is sailing on their voyage, they have to pass through a narrow strait where there are "sirens" who lure the sailors to their deaths. They sing so beautifully that, unable to resist, they jump overboard and drown as they try to swim to the sirens. Ulysses knew he would be unable to resist their song, so he made his men tie him with strong ropes to the mast and plug their ears with wax so they would not be tempted. He gave strict orders that no one was to untie him as they sailed through the strait. Upon sailing through the strait, Ulysses was nearly driven mad by the beautiful song of the sirens and shouted for his men to untie him, but they could not hear him because of their earplugs. So because he was tied to the mast and the men used ear plugs, Ulysses and his men survived the temptation of the siren's song that would have led to their death.

We Christians must stop up our ears with wax by making ourselves deaf to sinful temptations (by prayer & fasting) and tie ourselves to the Cross of Christ with unbreakable bonds (faith and love for Christ). When we feel ourselves tempted by the 'sirens' of this world, (sinful distractions and temptations), we must confess our weakness and inability to overcome the passions merely by our own efforts. St. Paul prayed to Christ to remove a temptation from him, a 'thorn in the flesh,' sent by Satan to trouble him. Christ spoke to him: "My Grace is sufficient for thee, for My strength is made perfect in weakness. Most gladly therefore will I rather glory in my infirmities, that the power of Christ may rest upon me." (2 Cor. 12:9) So let us do likewise in this coming season of Great Lent that we may be renewed and resurrected with Christ at Pascha!
