



The News at St. Michael's –November 2020

Feasts & Fasts: We celebrated the **Feast of the Protection of the Theotokos** with a Vespers service on October 13th and Matins & Divine Liturgy on October 15th. Moleben & Akathist services were held on Wednesday evenings in October. Several Inquirer & Catechumen classes were held on Saturday afternoons.

<u>New Catechumen</u>: Congratulations to Caleb Eversole who was blessed to become a Catechumen after Divine Liturgy on Sunday, October 11th. Bill Tanner served as Caleb's Sponsor. May God grant Caleb many years!

Upcoming Feasts & Fasts: Our Patronal Feast for **St. Michael the Archangel** will be celebrated with a Slava service & potluck meal this year following the Divine Liturgy on **Sunday, November 22nd**. After Liturgy, we will proceed to the Edgewater Clubhouse at 111 Edgewater Drive, Madison, Alabama. This year's **Annual Assembly Meeting** will take place after the Slava & meal. Since there is only a capacity of 50 people and since the Annual Assembly is for parishioners in good standing, we cannot accommodate visitors this year and also ask that you sign up in advance. The **Nativity Fast** begins this year on **Saturday, November 28th** concluding with the Feast of the Nativity on January 7, 2021. Please be sure to check the monthly calendars for fasting instructions. Fish, wine and oil is allowed on the weekends (*with the exception of the weekend before the Nativity*) and on a number of other days. We will celebrate the **Feast of the Entrance of the Theotokos into the Temple** with Vespers on **Thursday, December 3rd** and Matins & Divine Liturgy on **Friday, December 4th.**

Catechumen & Inquirers Class: Classes are being held on Saturday afternoons at 4:00pm.

<u>St. Michael Moleben & Akathist Services</u>: These services will continue on Wednesday evenings at 6:00 pm (*with the exception of Wednesday, November 25th*). Our purpose is to ask the heavenly intercession of our Patron: St. Michael the Archangel, as we develop our new property.

Nativity Spiritual Study Group: will begin on Wednesday, Dec. 2 after Vespers. There will be a simple fasting meal followed by the spiritual study and discussion. A \$5 donation is requested to cover the costs of the meal.

<u>New Property</u>: The work on Phase 2 has begun with the grading of the parking area and bulldozers, front loaders and dump trucks can be seen up on the hill. The big excavator has been set up across the street on Madison Blvd. and we expect the lower utility work to begin any time now. Please keep the new property development in your prayers!

Thankfulness to God

Each year we celebrate the American Thanksgiving holiday in November and this can be a wonderful opportunity to reflect on our thankfulness to God. In the Gospel of Luke 17:11-19 there is an account of how ten men who were lepers called out to Jesus 'Master, have mercy on us,' and Jesus healed them. One of them was a Samaritan who received healing, and he glorified God and prostrated himself before Jesus and gave thanks. Jesus said, 'Were there not ten cleansed? But where are the nine? There are not found that returned to give glory to God, save this stranger.'



St. Theophylact says that of the ten lepers, the nine who were

Israelites showed themselves to be ungrateful, while it was the Samaritan, an accursed foreigner who returned to voice his gratitude...The ten lepers represent human nature, which was leprous with wickedness...but Christ healed the whole leprous nature of man, when, for every man's sake, He took flesh and tasted of death. Although the Jews had been cleansed of the uncleaness of their leprous sin, as far as it was the Lord's part to do, they showed themselves ungrateful and did not return from the path of their vain foolishness to give glory to God Who saved them...but the foreign and accursed people of the Gentiles recognized the One Who makes clean and they glorified Him by believing in Him.

St. John of Kronstadt wrote:

- Thank God every day with your whole heart for having given to you life according to His image and likeness—an intelligently free and immortal life.
- Especially thank God for having restored and guided you again unto life eternal after you had fallen into eternal death, and for having done so not simply by the action of His omnipotence, for this would not have been in conformity to His justice, but by having given for our redemption His only begotten Son, Who suffered and died for us.
- Thank Him also for again daily bestowing life upon you, who have fallen an innumerable multitude of times, by your own free will, through sins, from life into death, and that He does so as soon as you only say from your whole heart: "Father, I have sinned against heaven and before Thee!"
- Thank Him also for often delivering you from sickness, you who imprudently throw yourself into danger and sickness, the precursors of bodily death, for correcting your faults, and for not depriving you of earthly life; for everything is from Him, the All-merciful Father; everything comes from the First Origin of Life, Who has apportioned and lent life to all.

As we celebrate the Thanksgiving holiday with our family and friends, let us remember to give thanks to God for all the countless blessings He has given us, and which we often take for granted. Let's consider that while we may have struggles, there are people who have a much more difficult life than we do. Some live in unimaginable poverty while others are sick and dying or in prison. Some do not have the blessing of a church to attend or do not know about the Christian faith. Let us pray for those who are less fortunate than we are and let us give generously to those in need. Let us be thankful that we have been given a church to worship God in and that we have received the grace of Orthodox Christian Baptism! And let us pray for one another and give thanks to God for our church community and support our church with our talent, treasure and time that we may demonstrate our gratitude to God for His abundant mercy.
