The News at St. Michael's—April 2022

<u>Great Lent:</u> Cheesefare Week, the first week of March, was our final preparation for the Great Lenten Fast with 'Cheesefare' Week. On March 6th, we celebrated Forgiveness Sunday with the Vespers service after Liturgy and the ceremony of mutual forgiveness. Great Lent began in earnest on Monday, March 7th with the Canon of St. Andrew of Crete that continued on March 8th & 10th. On Wednesday, March 9th, we celebrated the Presanctified Liturgy, followed by a fasting meal and spiritual study group.

<u>Sunday of Orthodoxy:</u> On Sunday, March 13th, we hosted Holy Cross/Sts. Constantine & Helen Greek Orthodox Church for Vespers followed by a potluck meal. Many of guests commented on how inspiring and beautiful the was the Vespers service and how delicious was the potluck meal. After missing the past two years, it was good to be reunited with our brothers and sisters from the Greek church

<u>Spiritual Education</u>: The Lenten Spiritual Study Group continued on Wednesday evenings following the Presanctified Liturgy with a fasting meal. Also, the Inquirer and Catechumen classes have continued on Saturday afternoons.

<u>Man of God</u>: Many of our church members attended a showing of the new film "*Man of God*" which tells the story of St. Nektarios of Aegina (d. 1920). This was truly a blessing in the midst of our Lenten struggles, since St. Nektarios was such a powerful and sublime example of virtue in the face of unjust slanders and persecution. Yet, God glorified him as a miracle working saint.

<u>New Catechumens:</u> Nathan and Logan Hay were blessed as Catechumens on Sunday, March 27th following the Divine Liturgy. May God grant them many years!

New Property Update: Things have been moving forward with our new property, despite some of the weather delays. The sewer line has been installed beneath Madison Blvd. and connected to the City of Madison line. In the meantime, trenching work, manhole & sewer installation has started moving up the hill, though a cable location conflict has caused a delay as the depth & angle of the line must now be recalibrated. We have met with two contractors so far and are negotiating with one or two more to determine if they are available and interested in helping build our new church and fellowship hall. We also met with our architect team and have been told we can expect the drawings to be ready over the next 6-8 weeks. A survey crew recently helped mark off the borders of our new cemetery in order to facilitate the necessary appraisal and development work.

COMING UP:

<u>The Feast of the Annunciation of the Angel Gabriel to the Theotokos</u>: will be celebrated with Vespers and Liturgy of the Presanctified Gifts on <u>Wednesday</u>, <u>April 9th at 6pm</u>. Then on <u>Thursday</u>, April 7th, Matins will begin at 8:45am the Divine Liturgy at 10:00am.

<u>Baptism</u>: Catechumen Steve Gordon will receive Holy Baptism and Chrismation on Lazarus Saturday, April 16th, following the Divine Liturgy. May God grant many years to Steve!

Palm Sunday: On April 17th, we will celebrate the Entry of our Lord into Jerusalem.

<u>Holy Week</u>: There will be church services every day during Holy Week. Please see the April Calendar for details.

<u>Pascha</u>: The Bright Resurrection of our Lord, God and Saviour Jesus Christ will be celebrated with the traditional Paschal Vigil service on April 23rd beginning at 11:30pm. Compline, Matins and Divine Liturgy will follow. Paschal baskets will be blessed (and consumed!) afterwards. There will be a Paschal Agape Vespers on Sunday, April 24th at 3pm at the Edgewater Clubhouse (111 Edgewater Drive, Madison, AL) followed by a potluck meal and Easter egg hunt for the children.



From Repentance to Resurrection

We've passed the mid-point of Great Lent and are now fast approaching Holy Week and Pascha in just a few weeks. It's almost seems like a contradiction that while we are still observing the Great Lenten Fast, we begin to see the signs of Spring all around us. Flowers and leaves are starting to burst out everywhere, birds are joyfully singing and all creation is awakening to the renewal that Spring brings. Yet, our Holy Church continues to call us to fast, pray and repent.

If this seems like a contradiction, it's because it is: from a worldly point of view. However, God arranges things from His heavenly point of view which often turns everything upside down. The truth is that Great Lent is a time of spiritual transformation, not some gloomy process of beating our breasts and saying 'mea culpa.' Yes, we are called upon to repent of our sins, but this is a means to an end, not an end in itself! As we have often heard, the English word "repentance" is translated from the Greek word "metanoia." Metanoia is a combination of two words: "meta," meaning change or transformation and "noia" which refers to that higher part of our minds and hearts through which God reveals the spiritual world to us.

St. Diadochos of Photiki* once described what is meant by metanoia: "He who loves God consciously in his heart is known by God. (1 Cor. 8:3), for to the degree that he receives the love of God consciously in his soul, he truly enters into God's love. From that time on, such a man never loses an intense longing for illumination of spiritual knowledge, until he senses its strength in his bones and no longer knows himself, but is completely transformed by the love of God. He is both present in this life and not present in it; still dwelling in the body, he yet departs from it, as through love he ceaselessly journeys towards God in his soul. His heart now burns constantly with the fire of love and clings to God with an irresistible longing, since he has once and for all transcended self-love in his love for God. As St. Paul writes: 'If we go out of ourselves, it is because of God; if we are restrained, it is for your sake.' (2 Cor. 5:13)"

St. Diadochos lived in time when great saints and righteous ones were found in greater abundance than in our modern times today. Yet as has been observed by some Holy Fathers, although we may have arrived late to the banquet, yet we are still able to be nourished by the abundant scraps and crumbs that fell to the floor! May God bless us all to make good use of these last weeks before Pascha that we too may enter into the joy of Christ's Resurrection!

*St. Diadochos, (died c. 486AD), was bishop of Photiki in Epirus (northern Greece). He attended the Council of Chalcedon and fought against the Monophysite Heresy. He had a great influence on later saints, including St. Maximos the Confessor, St. John Climacus, St. Symeon the New Theologian and in general, the Hesychast movement of the 14th century. Some of his spiritual writings are found in The Philokalia, Vol. 1 (Feaber & Faber). His feast day is celebrated on March 29 according to the Julian Calendar.
