The News at St. Michael's -August 2021

<u>Feasts & Fasts</u>: We celebrated the <u>Feast of the Apostles</u> with a Matins/Liturgy on Monday, July 12th.

Spiritual Education: Inquirer/Catechumen classes were held on the Saturdays in July.

<u>Visit to Romanian Monastery:</u> Ask Matushka Ann about her visit to Holy Dormition Monastery in Rives Junction, Michigan. She visited the grave of Fr. Roman Braga.

Sale of 4319 Spartacus: Some parishioners may remember the discussion we had at our Annual Assembly meeting last year about the Church Board's decision to sell our present building. On July 14th, 2021, St. Michael's officially sold the property at 4319 Spartacus to Steve Walker of Southern Sealing, our neighbor on the north side of our property for the sum of \$225,000! The remaining balance of \$90,775 on our mortgage was then paid off (along with 2,298.29 in property taxes and fees) and \$131,926.71 in net revenue was deposited into the St. Michael's Building Fund that will be used for the new church building! We also signed a lease for up to two years and St. Michael's is now renting our former building from Steve. This means that 'the clock is ticking' on getting our new building built!

LOOKING AHEAD...

<u>Upcoming Services & Fasts</u>: We will celebrate the <u>Feast of the Transfiguration of the Lord</u> with a Vespers (instead of a moleben to St. Michael) on Wednesday, August 18 and a Matins Service at 8:45am and Divine Liturgy at 10:00am on Thursday, August 19. The Moleben services will continue throughout this month on the other Wednesday evenings in order to request heavenly intercessions from our Patron St. Michael the Archangel for our new church!

<u>The Dormition Fast:</u> begins on Saturday, August 14th in preparation for the Feast of the Dormition. Sometimes known as "Little Lent," the Dormition Fast is only two weeks in length, but is as strict as the Lenten Fast.

<u>Feast of the Dormition of the Theotokos</u> will be celebrated with a Vespers on Friday, August 27 and a Matins Service at 8:45 am and Divine Liturgy at 10:00 am on Saturday, August 28.

<u>Catechumen & Inquirers Class</u>: Classes will continue on Saturday afternoons at 4:00pm throughout the month of August (except for Saturday, August 28 because of the Feast of Dormition).

New Property & Phase 3 Capital Campaign: The end of Phase 2 is near and will hopefully be completed by the end of August. So far, 35 households have contributed pledges toward the new church building. While this is great news, we still need the remaining 24 households who have not yet sent in their pledge forms to do that as soon as possible! Then we can go to the bank and get approved for the construction loan to build the new church/fellowship hall building! With your support, it's possible that we could be moved into our new church & fellowship hall before the end of next year, 2022! Redeeming the Time

During the month of August, the Liturgical Year draws to a close with the last two of the 12 great feasts: The Transfiguration of the Lord & The Dormition of the Most Holy Theotokos. As St. John Maximovitch once said that the Liturgical Year begins with the Nativity of the Theotokos (Sept. 8/21) and ends with the Dormition of the Theotokos (Aug. 14/27). This is because the Lord chose to become Incarnate as a man through the Most Holy Theotokos and Ever Virgin Mary. The Liturgical Year is like a spiritual journey that takes us through all the major events that happened in the lives of our Lord, God and Saviour Jesus Christ and His most holy Mother. As Sacred Tradition attests, the Lord Jesus Christ became the "Second Adam" and the Most Holy Theotokos became the "Second Eve." Together, they reversed the consequences of the Fall and opened the way to salvation for the human race. The Liturgical Year affords us the ongoing opportunity to "Redeem the Time" as St. Paul says, because the Holy Fasts and Feasts throughout the year, literally sanctify time itself by drawing down the Grace of the Holy Spirit and bringing heaven and earth together.

The Transfiguration of the Lord on Mt. Tabor, was an image for us of Deification, or Theosis. The Lord appeared in the glory of the Uncreated Light before His disciples, who witnessed this "as far as they were capable." The Holy Fathers have taught us a three-fold path to salvation: Purification, Sanctification and Deification. We have a wonderful image and experience of this three-fold process every single week when we prepare for and participate in the Divine Liturgy. We <u>purify</u> our bodies by observing the Eucharistic Fast from midnight on Saturday evening until after we've received Holy Communion on Sunday and we purify our souls through the cleansing sacrament of Holy Confession. At Vespers the evening before and at Matins the morning of the Divine Liturgy, we <u>sanctify</u> our minds and hearts through prayer in preparation for Holy Communion. If we have prepared worthily, we are united to our Lord Jesus Christ, through partaking of His most Holy Body and Blood and participate in the process of <u>Deification</u> "as far as we are capable."

The Feast of the Dormition of the Most Holy Theotokos provides us with a sort of "spiritual preview" of what we hope to inherit when we leave this earthly life. As the Troparion of the Feast states, "... Thou wast translated to Life, O Mother of Life..." The Most Holy Theotokos was raised up to heaven after her repose from this earthly life. In a way, she prefigures what is in store for all those "who deny themselves, take up their cross, a follow Christ."

May Christ our God bless us to 'finish the course' of this Liturgical Year and to make good use of the time we have remaining in this earthly life by redeeming the time!
