<u>Feasts & Fasts</u>: We celebrated the <u>Feast of the Ascension</u> with a Vespers service on Wednesday, June 9th and Matins/Liturgy on June 10th. ...This kind goeth not out but by prayer and fasting... (Matt. 17:21)

We have been observing the Apostles Fast that began at the end of June and will come to a close on the Feast of the Apostles on July 12th (civil calendar date). It's a good opportunity for us to revisit the subject of fasting. There is sometimes a misunderstanding about the spiritual practice of fasting. Even today, some Orthodox Christians feel that

there is no need to fast, that perhaps this is a practice reserved only for monastics and clergy. Yet, fasting is of tremendous spiritual benefit for us. The Lord passed on this practice to His disciples, not as a suggestion, but as a commandment.

In Matthew 9:14-15, we read "Then came to him the disciples of John, saying, Why do we and the Pharisees fast oft, but thy disciples fast not? And Jesus said unto them, Can the children of the bridechamber mourn, as long as the bridegroom is with them? but the days will come, when the bridegroom shall be taken from them, and then shall they fast."

As Archbishop Averky wrote in his book The Struggle for Virtue, "Could it be that God created monks and laypeople separately? Could it be that God breathed the breath of life only into the faces of monks, leaving laypeople like mute animals? Could it be that only the spirits of monks strive for God, seeking communion with Him, while laypeople are not called to a life in God? Could it be that only monks have inherited a nature damaged by the ancestral sin and therefore must battle against sinful habits? Could it be that the Lord Jesus Christ, our Saviour, came to earth only for monks, and not for everyone? Could it be that He founded His Church, in which grace-filled power is given for overcoming the law of sin and evil habits, for monks alone? Could it be that the Gospel was written only for monks alone? Could it be that the Lord calls them alone, and not everyone, to His eternal, blessed Kingdom to come? Who would dare claim this?...It is clear that everyone, if he desires to save himself from evil must enter the path of spiritual life—that is to become an ascetic struggler to some extent."

St. John Chrysostom once gave a homily from the Gospel of Matthew chapter 17, when the Lord healed the possessed boy: "This kind goeth not out but by prayer and fasting." St. John said "And yet, if faith be requisite," one may say, "what need of fasting?" Because together with our faith, that also brings no small power. For it both implants much strictness, and of a man makes one an angel, and fights against the incorporeal powers: yet not by itself, but prayer too is needed, and prayer must come first. See, at any rate, how many blessings spring from them both. For he that is praying as he ought, and fasting, hath not many wants, and he that hath not many wants, cannot be covetous; he that is not covetous, will also be more disposed for almsgiving. He that fasts is light, and winged, and prays with wakefulness, and quenches his wicked lusts, and propitiates God, and humbles his soul when lifted up. Therefore even the apostles were almost always fasting."

St. Nicholai Velimirovic once wrote: "Fasting and prayer are two pillars of faith; two living fires that burn up the evil spirits. Through fasting, all bodily passions are calmed and destroyed, especially immorality; through prayer, all other passions of soul, heart and mind are calmed and destroyed: evil intentions and evil deeds, revenge, envy, hatred, malice, pride, ambition and the others. By fasting, the vessels of body and soul are cleansed of their filthy contents of worldly passions and vices; by prayer, the grace of the Holy Spirit is drawn down into the empty, cleansed vessel—and the fullness of faith consists in the abiding of God's spirit in man."

Brothers and Sisters, let us contemplate these beneficial words from our Holy Fathers. And let us do our best to keep the Apostles Fast as the Holy Church has established for our spiritual benefit, that we may be prepared to enter into the Kingdom of Heaven. Glory be to God!
